* Riders competing in a Novice test will not receive qualifying scores for qualifying for Nationals, or for Rider Ranking.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES – Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by:

- 1) Your accurate and complete entry form signed waiver
- 2) All competitors must be a current OnTRA member.
- 3) Any rider(s) entering any class at this horse show MUST be current members in good standing of the Ontario Equestrian Federation (OEF) and EC and must supply original or photocopy of their 2010 membership to the show secretary before they will be issued a number.
- 4) **AWARDS - RIBBONS** -1st through 6th. There is no prize money.
Riders *must be classified* and ride in the grade to which they have been assigned **or** must ride '*Hors Concours*'.
'Hors Concours' entrants are eligible for participation ribbon only.
- 5) **FREESTYLE MUSIC** – **Must be submitted when competitor package is picked up and on CD.**
- 6) Total entries is limited to 25. Registration forms must accompanied by payment must be received by OnTRA no later than the closing date of Friday March 12, 2010. Credit card payment is not available. Please make cheques payable to OnTRA.
- 7) In order to attain *qualifying* National scores include a copy of *Para Equestrian Canada* membership.
- 8) Open dressage classes are covered by the rules of current FEI Para Equestrian and EC rules. Para Equestrian tests and rules can be found on the website at www.fei.org
- 9) All riders must be suitably attired with an ASTM approved helmet: Competitors must wear proper fitting headgear with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted on the event grounds. Boots/shoes with a heel are required.
- 10) The Show Committee reserves the right to deny riders competing if not safely attired.
- 11) **Warm up will be available as posted.** Warm up will be in the indoor arena. The indoor competition ring will be open to riders on Saturday starting at 8am. Please ensure that you wear your competition number at all times.
- 12) **INSURANCE** – All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. Third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events is necessary.
- 13) Dressage Tests – Grade 1 to 4 tests will be conducted in a 20m x 40m ring
- 14) **STABLING** – The cost per stall is \$40.00 per day or part thereof for the competition Sunday only. Fee includes first bedding all other is the responsibility of the competitor. Please bring your own hay, feed and buckets.
- 15) If requesting stabling, a photocopy of a current 2010 Coggins Test is required and vaccination certificate.
- 16) **Stabling form** if stabling is required with your cheque, made payable to: CARD.
- 17) **PARKING** – Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. Please do not park in the entrance area.
- 18) **DRUG TESTING** – EC/FEI Drug and Medications rules apply at these shows. Any horse entered in any class at any competition subject to the requirement to pay drug-testing fees may, while on the competition grounds and on the recommendation of the chair of the provincial Equine Medications Control committee or the chair's appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing.
- 19) No stallions are permitted.
- 20) No dogs allowed at the show.

EQUINE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

EQUINE CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EQUINE CANADA is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve. They must never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that the owner, trainer, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.
